As we have mentioned, “The Ten Standards of Excellence” provides an excellent list of goals for which to strive. But, how do you measure how you are performing against those goals? Having a list of questions to ask yourself and your leaders will help you determine your progress.

As you answer the questions, it may seem that raw numbers don’t mean much to you now. Let’s say, for example, that you’ve just completed your first year of club and you calculate an average weekly attendance of 32 clubbers. That number alone may not be very revealing, but it gives you a basis of comparison. Next year, if you average 50 clubbers a week, you’re probably doing something right. But if your average attendance drops to 20 clubbers, you need to have a prayer and planning meeting quick!
